# **BOARD OF DIRECTORS ELECTION**

As of publication, eight Del Tura residents have declared their candidacy for the upcoming election.

These candidates will be vying for the three threeyear seats and two of the vacancies that need to be filled. Both are one-year terms. Membership dues MUST be paid by Friday, January 13, 2023 to be eligible to vote; one vote per household. Ballots will be mailed January 19, 2023.

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
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# GOOD TIMERS' By Sandra Boykin



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




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# TURA CERT INFORMATION

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


